The Prophet Nahum, which means "God consoles"

Prophet Nahum was a Minor Prophet in the Bible. He is known for prophesying the doom of Nineveh, the capital of the cruel Assyrian Empire, around the 7th century BC. His prophecy brought comfort to Judah by foretelling justice against their oppressors. His message was one of divine judgment on Assyria's wickedness, contrasting God's wrath with His faithfulness and detailing Nineveh's inevitable, total destruction, a poetic prophecy fulfilling about 612 BC.

Key Facts about Nahum:

- **Name Meaning:** His name, "Nahum," means "God consoles," reflecting the comfort his prophecy brought to Judah.
- **Origin:** He was from Elkosh, though the exact location is debated (possibly Galilee or Judah).
- **Time Period:** He prophesied between 663 BC (after Thebes' fall) and 612 BC (Nineveh's fall), likely around 612 BC, predating the final destruction of Nineveh.
- **Core Message:** His book is a powerful poem about God's judgment on Nineveh for its cruelty, idolatry and injustice, offering hope to Israel.
- **Contrast to Jonah:** While Jonah brought a message of *potential* repentance to Nineveh, Nahum delivered a message of *inevitable* destruction after they relapsed into wickedness.
- **Literary Style:** He's renowned for his vivid, powerful and poetic language, describing the siege and fall of Nineveh in dramatic detail.
- **Fulfillment:** His prophecy accurately predicted Nineveh's final ruin by a coalition of Babylonians, Medes and Scythians in 612 BC, leaving the city desolate.

Nahum 1: 7, "The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble, and He knows those who trust in Him."
