# A SHORT SUMMERY OF PHILIP, THE APOSTLE

Through Philip the Word is charged with power (John 6: 7). 'Philip' means a lover of horses. We gather from this that he represents the faculty in us that, through love, masters the vital forces; hence we identify Philip as power.

Philip was one of the first disciples to follow Jesus and he wasted no time encouraging others, like Nathanael, to do the same. Philip plays a larger role in the Gospel of John than he does in the other three Gospels.

Jesus had just called Simon Peter and Andrew to be his disciples. As he was leaving Galilee, he would call more to follow him. Jesus, to Philip, in the distance, "Come Philip, follow me! And, bring your brother Nathaniel!"

In John 14: 8-9, Philip asks Jesus, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." Jesus replies, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and yet you still don't know who I am? Anyone who has seen the Father!"

Although little is known about him after the ascension of Christ, Bible historians believe Philip preached the gospel in Phrygia, in Asia Minor, and died a martyr there at Hierapolis. One thing we know for certain, Philip's search for the truth led him directly to the promised Messiah.

Philip was a disciple and apostle of Jesus in the Gospel of John. He convinced Nathaniel to join Jesus' disciples, helped Gentiles learn about Jesus' teachings and distributed the miraculous bread and fish to the multitude that Jesus fed.

Again, being led by God's Spirit, Philip was sent to Caesarea to teach there (Acts 8: 39 - 40). Philip's life was one of service to God. Wherever we go and whatever path is set before us, we must continue to serve and live God's way of life, teaching and being an example for others.

What We Can Learn From Philip?

- Walk with God and you'll be led by the Spirit. Philip was totally sold out to God.
- Be sensitive to the movements of God.
- The more Scripture you know, the better equipped you'll be.
- Ask if someone wants to believe.
- The Gospel is for everyone.
- Baptism testifies our faith.

### 1. Which of these did not have their name changed in the Bible?

- A) Sarah
- B) Abraham
- C) Jacob
- D) David
- E) Peter

Answer: D - David did not have his name changed. Sarah was Sarai (Gen. 17: 15), Abraham was Abram (Gen. 17: 5), Jacob became Israel (Gen. 32: 28) and Peter was Simon (John 1: 42).

#### 2. What names was Moses supposed to give to the Israelites when asked about who had sent him?

- A) "Elohim"
- B) "El Shaddai"
- C) "I am who I am"
- D) "I am the Lord"

Answer: C - "I am who I am" was the answer given by God to Moses when he asked about his name. Exodus 3: 13 - 14.

- C) Enoch
- D) Canaan

Answer:  $\mathbf{C}$  - After leaving God's presence, Cain built a city and named it after his first son: Enoch. Genesis 4: 16 – 17.

# 6. What did God tell Abraham to look at when he made him a promise?

- A) For the rainbow in the sky, a symbol of the covenant with Abraham
- B) To the sand of the sea, that he might count the grains of sand.
- C) To the stars in the sky, so that he could count them.
- D) To the forest of the promised land, to count the fruit trees

Answer: **C** - God had the stars of heaven counted, if he could count them at all, as an illustration of the great offspring he would give to Abraham through Isaac (Genesis 15: 5).
