A SHORT SUMMERY OF BARTHOLOMEW, THE APOSTLE

Nathanael, believed to be the disciple Bartholomew, experienced a jarring first encounter with Jesus. When the apostle Philip called him to come and meet the Messiah, Nathanael was skeptical, but he followed along anyway. As Philip introduced him to Jesus, the Lord declared, "Here is a true Israelite, in whom there is nothing false." Immediately Nathanael wanted to know, "How do you know me?" Jesus got his attention when he answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." Shocked and surprised, he declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel." Nathanael's familiarity with Old Testament prophecies caused him to recognize Jesus for who He was, the promised Messiah, Son of God and King of Israel (John 1: 45 - 49).

Bartholomew was one of the 12 main disciples of Jesus Christ. In the entire New Testament, his name only appears in the four lists of the twelve apostles (Matthew 10: 2-4, Mark 3: 16-19, Luke 6: 14-16, Acts 1: 1-13).

Nathanael is usually identified as Bartholomew, the Apostle mentioned in the Synoptic Gospels and Acts 1:13. The reason for this identification is Bartholomew being a surname (Nathanael Bar-Tolmai; meaning Nathanael, son of Tolmai), and because Bartholomew and Philip are always paired together in the synoptic gospels.

This is all we know about Bartholomew / Nathanael from Scripture. As an apostle, Bartholomew saw the risen Lord Jesus (John 21: 2) and was present at the Ascension (Acts 1: 1-11). Tradition indicates that Bartholomew was a minister of the gospel in Persia and India. There is no biblical record of his death, but one tradition has it that he was tied up in a sack and dropped into the sea. Another tradition claims that he was crucified. All traditions agree that he died a martyr's death, as did all the apostles except for John.

Bartholomew teaches us that attachment to Jesus can be lived and witnessed without performing sensational deeds. We also learn not to prejudge other people. Bartholomew demonstrates the importance of trusting God, even when faced with challenges, as well as the power of sharing the Gospel through both words and actions. Furthermore, Bartholomew's story highlights the significance of prayer and reflection in developing a stronger relationship with God and the ability to overcome obstacles.
