# A SHORT SUMMARY OF THOMAS, THE APOSTLE

According to the New Testament, Thomas, also known as Didymus, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. As with Thomas' early life, little is known about his adult life before following Jesus. Some hypothesize that he might have been a fisherman, since Thomas was recorded as fishing with the disciples Andrew and Peter, who were fishermen, before one of Jesus' appearances after his resurrection.

There's a good chance that Thomas was a twin. John tells us that Thomas was known as "Didymus" the Greek word for twin (John 11: 16, 20: 24, 21: 2). Interestingly, Thomas also means twin in Aramaic, the common language throughout first-century Palestine.

Although all of the Gospels mention Thomas, it's only the Gospel of John that records any of Thomas' words. Church tradition tells us that Thomas was a missionary who might have ended up in India, but it's hard to say with any certainty how far east he traveled.

The apostle Thomas is often known as "Doubting Thomas", because he refused to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead until he saw and touched Christ's physical wounds. Thomas is often condemned for his lack of belief, but he was equally courageous, willing to stand by Jesus in dangerous times. He also relentlessly sought the Truth. Like an inquisitive child, he constantly asked questions. Thomas was prone to extremes, as he had demonstrated courageous faith, willing to risk his own life to follow Jesus into Judea.

There is an important lesson to be gained from studying Thomas: If we are truly seeking to know the truth and are honest with ourselves and others about our struggles and doubts, God will faithfully meet us and reveal himself to us, as he did for Thomas. Thomas's great strength was his superb analytical mind, coupled with his unflinching courage, once he had made up his mind.

His great weakness was his suspicious doubting, which he never fully overcame throughout his whole lifetime in the flesh. Thomas' moment of bravery didn't entirely define him, and neither should his moment of doubt. We all have moments we're proud of and other moments we wish we could forget. What we learn from Thomas is that being in Jesus' presence brought out the best in him by increasing his faith
