A SHORT SUMMARY OF MATTHIAS, THE APOSTLE

Matthias is considered the "13th Apostle" and was the only disciple who wasn't personally called by Jesus. He was chosen by the remaining eleven apostles to replace Judas Iscariot after Judas's betrayal and death. Matthias had followed Jesus throughout his ministry and was elected to ensure there were twelve apostles to receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and to continue spreading the Gospel.

Matthias is only mentioned by name in Acts 1, verses 23 and 26, but from that point on, whenever the Twelve apostles are referred to collectively, he's with them. Beyond these two mentions in Acts, the New Testament tells us nothing about him. However, we do know that he met the requirements Peter established for replacing Judas: he'd followed Jesus since his baptism by John the Baptist, and he witnessed Jesus' ascension to heaven.

Before the apostles chose Matthias, Peter declared: "Therefore it is necessary to choose one of the men who have been with us the whole time the Lord Jesus was living among us, beginning from John's baptism to the time when Jesus was taken up from us. For one of these must become a witness with us of his resurrection." (Acts 1: 21 - 22.)

As one of the Twelve, Matthias would have been among the first Christians to receive the Holy Spirit. He played an important role in launching the movement which became the world's largest religion.

As was the case with several of the more obscure disciples, the early church was often confused about Matthias' identity, which makes it difficult for us to learn more about him. Some argued that he was the same person as Nathanael or Zaccheus, and they even mixed him up with Matthew.

The true lesson from the life of Matthias is what the disciples did before his selection was made - they prayed. Prayer is the foundation and starting point of every decision in the life of every Christian.


